## Chronology

- 1770 Born April 7 at Cockermouth in Cumberland.
- 1778 Death of mother, Ann Wordsworth.
- 1779 Enters school near Esthwaite Lake in the lake country.
- 1783 Death of father, John Wordsworth.
- 1787–1791 Attends St. John's College, Cambridge University.
  - 1790 Walking tour of France, Germany, and Switzerland.
  - 1791 Walking tour of North Wales, where he ascends Mount Snowdon.
- **1791–1792** Residence in France, where he associated with moderate faction of the revolutionists. Love affair with Annette Vallon. Birth of their daughter, Anne Caroline.
  - **1793** Publication of *An Evening Walk* and *Descriptive Sketches*.
  - **1795** Death of college friend Raisley Calvert, whose legacy enables Wordsworth to devote himself to poetry.
- **1795–1798** Settles with his sister, Dorothy, first at Racedown, then at Alfoxden. In 1797–1798, he is constantly in the company of Samuel Taylor Coleridge.
  - 1798 In September, *Lyrical Ballads* is published.
- 1798–1799 Winters with Dorothy at Goslar in Germany.
  - **1799** Moves with Dorothy to Dove Cottage, Grasmere, where he writes *The Prelude* in its first version, in two parts.
  - 1800 Second edition of *Lyrical Ballads*, with "Preface" added.
  - 1802 Marries Mary Hutchinson.
  - **1805** Death of his brother John Wordsworth in a shipwreck in February. *The Prelude*, in thirteen books, is finished, but the poet chooses not to publish it.

- Publishes *Poems in Two Volumes*.
- **1810–1812** Rift with Coleridge; subsequent friendship is never the same.
- **1813–1842** Becomes a government tax collector for Westmoreland. Lives at Rydal Mount, near Ambleside.
  - Publishes *The Excursion*.
  - Becomes poet laureate.
  - Dies April 23 at Rydal Mount. *The Prelude*, in fourteen books, is published posthumously.
